




MADISON SHAMOUN





You have been actively protesting for Black Lives Matter in LA. Can you tell us a little bit about this experience?


It's just heartbreaking. I went to the first one in Santa Monica, and I had never been to one before. All sorts of people came together to take a knee, pay tribute, and let marginalized voices be heard. The escalation to violence was unfortunate, because the protests were entirely peaceful, and the destruction that did happen wasn't from anyone at the protests. It was upsetting for so many reasons.

It seems like the major media isn't covering the movement as much. Do you have any thoughts on how these voices can continue to be heard?

Keep your foot on the gas! Whether that means supporting black businesses and art, on social media or in real life. It's not a movement that's going anywhere, this is for life. Be ready to be an ally for life.

It really varies! It can be a last-minute self-tape that casting will book off of or an audition, then callback, then director's session, then screen test. Typically, the bigger the part, the lengthier the process.

What were your thoughts after reading the script? How different are you from your character?

There's usually a tiny bit of me in them, but I'm pretty different from all the characters I've played. Reading the script is one of my favorite parts of the process! I love seeing everything come to life in my head as I'm reading it.

YEM: Since starting in the business, what's the best advice you've gotten?

Madison: To be kind to myself. Actors are often their own worst enemies, and we can be our toughest critics. My professors and mentors always say, "be kind to my actors" and I love that.

I have "Forgive Me" by ChloexHalle on repeat. The vocals are insane, those girls are so talented. It's a total bop.






