Greene, who thrives on being challenged professionally, has demonstrated versatility in her transition from children's comedic acting to adult drama in ABC's "A Million Little Things," now in its third season. Greene plays Sophie Dixon, the 16-year-old daughter to Jon and Delilah Dixon (played by Ron Livingston and Stephanie Szostak).

"**T**o anyone out there who is hoping to become an actor, or has any other dreams, every great dream begins with a dreamer," is Lizzy Greene's advice. The 18-year-old actress is currently starring as "Sophie Dixon," in ABC's *A Million Little Things*.

"I can't spoil the story lines, but I can say you really get to see a different side of her," Greene tells INLOVE about her character in season 2. "Something is going to happen that really shakes her mentality and changes her relationships with some of the other characters. I love a challenge, and Sophie's gonna have a few this next season."

Greene grew up on television. Before her ABC hit, she was a familiar face on Nickelodeon. However, it was her role as "Dawn Harper" in *Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn*, that won the admiration of fans.

In getting to know her, we discovered that there are easily a million little things to love about Lizzy Greene.

Sari: *How do you balance school, your acting career, and your personal life?*

Lizzy Greene: It's definitely a challenge. I get

asked a lot if I even go to school, but spoiler alert: the answer is yes. School is the first thing on my list of priorities. I always try to finish it as early as I possibly can; that way, I can focus on my career and job at hand without stress and distractions. I also try my best to keep up with my friends back home. I will say, it isn't easy being in a different country filming while your friends are back home, but a good thing is a lot of my friends are also in the business, so we understand each other's demanding schedules. When we do meet up, I always have the best time. Being an actor means a lot of juggling, but I wouldn't change a thing.

Sari: *You play Sophie Dixon on "A Million Little Things." Tell me more about your character and what your experience on that show has been like?*

LG: It's been one of the best experiences of my life. I have the most incredible castmates and the most wonderful crew. I have been able to jump into a whole different genre of acting, and I think it's been a super healthy transition. Not to mention, I get to live in Vancouver, which is the coolest city ever. Since the show deals with such a heavy topic [suicide], I have also been able to do my

If you are currently under eighteen or maybe just hold a special place in your heart for the green-slime shenanigans of Nickelodeon, you are undoubtedly very familiar with Lizzy Greene. The young actress, just seventeen, starred in Nickelodeon's Nicky, Ricky, Dicky, & Dawn for four years before transitioning to a pivotal role on ABC's A Million Little Things. Amassing over three million followers on Instagram and over half a million subscribers on YouTube, Greene is dominating both the small screen and the social scene.

From Dallas to Los Angeles to Vancouver, Lizzy Greene continues to dominate whatever domain she enters. "Spontaneous, optimistic, [and] hardworking," Greene has always loved the art of performing, both on stage and on screen. "I started theater when I was in second grade and I really just wanted to be on Broadway," the actress begins. "I did shows with our little theater group in Dallas and found a family of people who all shared the same interests I did." After performing for a few years at the local theater, Greene was signed by an agency and began auditioning for television. "One thing led to another and I was swept up into a Nickelodeon show, then onto ABC, and the rest is yet to come!" Greene gleams. "I still have many moments where I think, 'How the heck did this happen?'"

Landing her first starring role in *Nicky, Ricky, Dicky, & Dawn* at the age of eleven, the actress spent four of her formative years filled with sitcom hi-jinx and the honing of her comedic craft. Growing up in the public eye, however, has not been that difficult for Greene. "It's been pretty cool because a lot of my fans and supporters have grown up alongside me," shares the actress. Following the Nickelodeon show's final season in 2018, Greene was offered the role of Sophie Dixon in ABC's hit drama *A Million Little Things*, starring alongside notable actors like David Giuntoli (*Grimm*), Romany Malco (*Weeds*, *40 Year Old Virgin*), James Roday Rodriguez (*Psych*, *Dukes of Hazard*), and Stephanie Szostak (*Dinner for Schmucks*, *Iron Man 3*).

"My transition from a kid's show to a drama was timely, but also quite difficult," reveals Greene. "The first few months I was on the show I was really learning how to act all over again, as it was not only a single cam, but also with a lot more serious subject matter." Armed with training and determination, the actress learned from her peers, adjusted to the new situation, and prevailed. "I learned so much from my costars — and I describe it as like going to acting class every day. Most of my crew mates have done this for so long and it really shows through their craft," admires Greene. "So, I'm always happy to take advice from them,

as well as give them advice on social media," laughs the modern day influencer.

While Greene might advise her costars on social media management, the actress shared one of her favorite days on set where her costars guided her behind the wheel, literally. "I was shooting a scene in season 1 with Romany and James. I was fifteen and learning to drive in the script. And though I had my permit in real life, I'd never driven such an expensive car, much less with cameras and a crew of people inside," Greene reminisces. "So there were many moments where the two of them were legit teaching me things between takes and there were also some moments where I made a few laughable mistakes.

Shoutout to James for jumping into the driver's side a few times to fix them," Greene laughs. "I did successfully parallel park between a Tesla and a Mercedes, which was nerve-racking to say the least. Definitely one of my favorite shoot days."

When she is not practicing to be the next road racer, Greene is always exploring an artistic avenue. "I'm drawing every minute of my free time," the actress admits. "My family

always jokes that I can't have any form of paper in front of me without drawing on it." While the actress has an affinity for the arts, her real passion parallels her paramount success as an actor-on-the-rise. Working in a range of entertainment genres and alongside covet-worthy cast mates has been "crazy and exhilarating" proclaims Greene. "I've been very lucky to have met some incredible actors and work with some amazing people."

With all of her early successes, Greene has certainly learned many lessons along the way. "You learn to hustle and not take things personally, because a lot of what you go out for you don't get. If you can learn to take rejection with pride, and turn the frustration into drive, you will only get better," imparts the flourishing talent. "To my aspiring actors," she further advises, "I always recommend to read scripts from your favorite movies and shows because you can see how the actors and filmmakers interpreted the text and brought it to life."

"Some other tips I give is to never rush (unless it's a character choice), use everything around you when you act, and to treat silence as if it's precious," Greene continues. "A quote from Uta Hagen's book, *Respect for Acting*, is that 'you're never done.' When you act, there is no beginning or end, there is only the 'now.'" The "now" for many people, including Greene, has either been put on hold entirely or derailed indefinitely due to the global pandemic. For her mental health and choice of self-care, the actress used to frequent yoga and barre classes, often attending every night. Now that lockdown measures are still affecting the normalcy of everyday life and events, Greene has been focusing more on her art and on running. "Both are really therapeutic for me, as one allows me to be creative and the other allows me to de-stress my mind," shared the starlet.

The time in quarantine has affected more than just her exercise regimen. It has also affected her creativity, content creation, and her process as an actor — though, not necessarily in a negative way. "In quarantine, I'm sure all of us spent some time watching movies and TV," the actress begins.

"I specifically grew a lot in this time period because I felt as if I was doing film study on the performances I was watching. Since I had such a long hiatus from *AMLT*, I spent a lot of my time watching masterclasses and reading books and scripts from my favorite films. To those who are feeling a loss of inspiration, I feel you!" empathized Greene. "What helped me combat un-productivity was the planning and goal setting I made myself for every month. I daydreamed a lot, worked on multiple projects, really focused on school, and chatted with my team every now and then to keep the hard-working mindset alive," divulged the actress. "Sharing your goals with others helps to keep you inspired and it also means that you can encourage each other to get to where you want to go. Just remember, there is never a victory without a leap or an idea."

Greene has certainly made the leap from primarily acting to becoming a social media influencer to boot. Familiar with the life alterations of being an actor, the public forum of social media has not deterred the rising star from continuing to maintain her authenticity. And while the budding actress does boast quite the following, Greene does prefer to maintain a modicum of privacy. "I like to keep my private life private and since actors

have such public lives to begin with, there's something special about having some things to yourself," Greene explained. As for any catty comments or malicious mentions, Greene understands that these kinds of attacks, unfortunately, "come with the job" and does not take them to heart.

"Whenever I see a comment on my account that isn't the kindest, I try to empathize with the person who wrote it," Greene shared. "Since they don't know me, nor do I know them, I try not to take it personally. But, it's easy to get wrapped up in people's perception of you. As long as you know who you are and where your heart is," offers the actress, "you learn to smile and wave to comments like that."

Smiling and maturely waving to the evolving pressures and expectations of the spotlight has allowed Greene to stay true to herself. "Being authentic is quite possibly the most important thing one has to remember in this business," Greene states. "Your originality keeps you different from everyone around you and by choosing to not conform, you are rare. I know it's cheesy to say 'be yourself'," the actor grins, "but choose to be a sunflower in a field of dandelions."

Staying grateful and grounded is something my family has enforced in me my whole life — and that starts with being thankful for everything you are granted,” Greene exclaims with an air of humble gratitude. “Keep family and friends important, and never turn your back on those who care about you.”

Striving to be that sunflower amongst dandelions demands confidence — a quality which Greene unapologetically emits — and sacrifice. “I always say you have to sacrifice 90% to get 10,” the actress wisely begins. “Your work becomes a part of you and sometimes that means missing out on a lot of different milestones in life. However, I’ve been doing this since I was ten, so I’ve learned to love everything about the business. And while I do get a little tired of waking up at 4-5 a.m. all the time,” Greene cringed reminding her often before dawn call time, “acting is everything to me and I hope to do it for decades to come.”

As busy as she will be with acting for the next several decades, Greene is currently painting her horizon as she gazes into her future endeavors. “This industry is great because there isn’t a bottle cap on creativity. I definitely see a portion of my career being focused on producing and filmmaking, as I have a few film ideas and remakes in mind at the moment,” the actress affirmed. “Fashion is also a large passion of mine as well, so let’s keep all the doors open!”

With open doors and an open mindset, Greene is the type of fashionista who will wear anything, as long as the styling is right. “I’m a big fan of mixing patterns and fabrics, layering different items, and mismatching jewelry, but the accessories are everything,” the actress confessed. “The shoes and jacket are the make or break pieces in my outfits.” For Greene, however, no outfit is complete without her mini Takashi Murakami LV bag. “It was a gift from one of my fav crew members on NRDD,” Greene heartened, “so it’s extra special.” In that bag? You will probably find her Jo Malone’s Velvet Rose and Oud perfume, the one beauty item the actress cannot live without.

With her acting career expanding, her original sense of style sharpening, and her social media influence growing, there is so much we can expect to see next for mature for her years, Lizzy Greene: “a venture into film, the release of some music, maybe a deeper dive into art, and a whole lot of surprises.”






ACTRESS LIZZY GREENE: 'I'VE ALWAYS WANTED A DOG I COULD REALLY BOND WITH'

At 17 Lizzy Greene Sure Has a World of Knowledge To Share

Lizzy Greene has been acting from practically the minute she could walk. With a slew of acting credits under her belt comes an enormous amount of knowledge that she is able to share with the most seasoned actor or actress. Cool America had a talk with her about, acting, life and her dream of Broadway.

Hi, Lizzy. How did you get involved in acting?

Hey there. I've been creating and putting on shows for my friends and family since I was old enough to walk. Something about performing always seemed to entice me, so when a music teacher told me I should try theater - I gladly obliged. I loved the whole environment and process that theater

offered, and my biggest goal in life was to be on Broadway. Somehow, I crossed paths with an agent during my run-in theater, and a few auditions later I had landed a role on Nickelodeon. My dream to be on Broadway was now renovated into a dream of being a film actress. That's how I got my start!

How do you prepare for the characters that you play?

I keep a notebook of random notes and thoughts I have for scenes. Sometimes I chat with my cast mates on their perception of the character choices, and sometimes I make up memories for the characters. It's a helpful trick especially if you read the script and something just doesn't seem right. Making memories and thoughts for your character help justify the decisions they make in the story, and also helps you better understand those moments. Now with auditions, I research the project as much as google will allow me - and comb through the script as best I can. I always like to think of the easy way to portray the character, then try the opposite. Casting directors see the same script every day, if you can take a different route, chances are they will listen.

What are you currently in or working on?

I'm currently working on my third season of A Million Little Things. It's an ABC show that tackles topics related to mental health, friendship, and loss.

Can you tell us about your character?

I play a girl named Sophie Dixon, a daughter coping with the suicide of her father. She is strong and dedicated, but also thoughtful and charismatic. She has a mission to live for herself and carry the legacy of her father.

From 1 to 10, how much is your character like you - 10 being a lot like you?

I would say 8 with Sophie. Whenever I read new scripts, I always find commonality in how Sophie reacts to things similarly to myself. We're both sweet, attentive, (sometimes stubborn) teenagers who love music and act from their heart instead of their head. We're also slow to ask for help, as we like to make our way as we go. But we cherish life and the people around us.

Who would you love to work with in the industry?

I have a massive list, but I would particularly love to work with Lin Manuel Miranda. I'm a huge Hamilton fan, and also grew up in theater, so it would be incredible to do some crazy cool Broadway production with him if he wrote another one. Fingers crossed!

Three things you would enjoy professionally if you didn't act?

Painting, Soccer, and Criminal psychology.

What tips would you give any aspiring actors/actresses?

Silence in film speaks volume - don't rush your pauses or moments of realization. Improvise with your costars before takes, it keeps things new and fresh. Everything is a prop - people are always fidgeting in real life and no one ever sits or stands

completely still when they say something - so use what's around you. Finally, your eyes and eyebrows are the most expressive part of your face in acting, so don't do deadpan!

Crazy year! How are you handling COVID-19?

As best as I can! The first few months of quarantine were really strange for me because I was also on hiatus for AMLT. Usually when I'm on hiatus, I'm working more out of Los Angeles on press and job-related projects. But with the quarantine, I was home in Texas since March. This was the first long break I've ever had, given that I've been always going 100 miles an hour since I started in this industry - and it was a weird feeling. I got into a workflow a few weeks in, as I really wanted to make sure I wasn't wasting this time. It's been a great time to develop creative ideas and make some plans for my future.

There's a lot going on in the world. What's resonated with you?

It's easy to find yourself going down a rabbit hole of stories every night- as it seems like this year is not forgiving in any way. But what resonates with me the most is the incredible power in numbers. When we saw moments this year that were unbelievable and cold, thousands of people stepped up and took it upon themselves to stand up for others.

Where do you see yourself in five years - at the ripe age of 22?

Hopefully having built a career in film, done some Broadway productions, and to be living in a cool apartment in upstate New York.

As a Gen Z do you feel you have a responsibility to help create a better world that your kids will be proud of when you're a parent?

Absolutely. My generation is truly incredible. To see that a lot of these large changes being made in society - are because of the voice of the newest generation

How do you feel about the industry?

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Do you have any goals?

Of course. Westwood

We are curious about your future plans.

Over the holidays, I had the opportunity to talk with Lizzy Greene, who plays Dawn on "Starry Starry." She was such a friendly and "down to earth" person, she shared with me that when shopping for the holidays, she ended up buying the one carrying the bags and sitting outside the stores while they shop.

Catriona Lamarque: Lizzy Greene is 19, how are you?

Catriona Lamarque: Obviously, we know that your career just began in 2013, I heard that you were selected from an audition, for a talent show.

Lizzy Greene: Yes, that's true.

CL: Oh, do you want to tell me more about that, how did that all come about?

LG: Absolutely, so when I was around 7 or 8, I actually much earlier than that, like 4 or 5, I just really was into performing in front of people and making people laugh. I really started out singing, I would do all my school talent shows and I was like, I want bigger than this. I really want to get into the theatre and acting business because I have always seen people on TV and they all look so good. It looks like such a fun job and I am a huge theatre junk, it was my favourite thing to do. So I just decided to get involved in the local theatre and that's where I really started out for sure, 100%, that's where I really got all of my accomplishments, like 100%. Because that is where I first started out, at the time when I started theatre I was like I want to turn 8, I was getting into these really dark plays I was playing tough kids or something like that. I just played all these really weird but really funny characters. Definitely at comedy theatre and it was all about making people laugh. The feeling of like making someone laugh when you are onstage and you get an uproar of laughter, it is literally the best feeling in the world. Nothing can top that, 100% the best thing, the day I was just doing my thing on stage, and an agent actually came to the show. She was friends with the director of all the plays and she came and she saw me. She was like, "well you're different, I have never seen such a little kid playing these dark roles and the laughter you are getting out of this." Of course, this was all new to me and I haven't even done theatre for like three years and now someone wants me to audition for TV. It was literally like, a stroke of lightning for me because I never expected to be up there, I only expected to continue theatre. So, I went out, I did a few auditions and eventually I got recognized by a manager, when I was doing an audition for an agent and he said "you are very different, I have never seen such a small child wanting to do things like this." So, he signed me and I got a few auditions out in Los Angeles. One of them, which was, Nicky, Ricky & Dawn, and that was everything to me because auditioning for Nickelodeon is every kid's dream. From auditioning for it I was instantly excited. I already felt like it was literally exciting as getting the

role, being able to audition for something like that I went into the Nickelodeon building after about 14 different auditions because you have to be the one kid they want. So, that like 14 auditions with different amounts of people, some of them were for in front of producers and things like that. Then I got the role, it was like for me. And so the next day we started shooting the pilot and then I flew back home and waited two months. I went back to school and back to being a totally normal kid, three two months later we realized the show got picked up. We temporarily moved out to L.A. in an apartment, and we had been shooting the show ever since, and it is an absolute dream.

CL: Oh wow, that sounds amazing, this is an incredible journey.

LG: Yeah, I find the story really cool for me, because I was the kid at school who was always sticking up for people and always being the one. Because all the popular kids they would be beating down on the other kids and I would be the one like, "hey that's not nice." I would love to stand up for people and so I was kind of the one getting beat down and all that stuff. Now I look back on that I have moved on, I have gone on to such bigger and better things and - it's just crazy for me.

CL: I can imagine you look back and you see how far you have come.

LG: Exactly, exactly since then all these girls are trying to be BFF with me now, and I'm like, oh, no thanks.

CL: Always that way, in the beginning, they want to be enemies and hateful, then suddenly you become successful and you are doing so well for yourself and they turn around and say, hey.

LG: They are like, "hey want to have a sleepover?" I am like no, not really.

CL: No definitely. Stay true to you.

LG: Thank you.

CL: I know you are in the Thunder man and Damage Goods, which was your first acting gig? Or were you in anything else apart from the three I am aware of?

LG: Well the first like really - acting gig I was I got, it was a pilot and it was local filmed in Texas where I live and it was like a thirty-minute show from there. So it was like a very local show and it didn't really get picked up but I did a few more things. I flew out to L.A. for another song gig where I was singing and it was for the Disney Channel. That was another big deal for me. I met Richard Sherman and all the Mary Poppins people. I actually recorded a song that plays at Disney Land, I went for the first time like a year or so ago. I heard the song I was singing in the girl sleep and I was like "wow that's crazy?" So I was like "oh wow two different theaters that are really cool." Another thing I did, was a pilot, it was called Designer's Goals with Anna Camp and I played for Virginia Madsen's friend and that was also really fun for me. That was out to L.A. that was my first L.A. gig I went and did the Disney thing, but yeah personally only a few things. I was very new to the business when I got on Nicky, Ricky & Dawn, I was just used to

the local theater it was a huge step for me.

Cl: I can imagine, obviously the first time you did your acting gig for TV rather than theater, how nervous were you? Obviously, you had the experience with acting in the theater but in a whole lot different when you are in front of a camera crew and a producer? Or is it similar? Are the many similarities?

IG: Well the first thing is, I am not really the type of person to get nervous, I am a very confident person. I have never really been nervous in my life. I am just always excited and love to be in the moment and just really enjoy new things and stuff. I am not, I try to be a real go-getter, always about new things and doing different things than what I had only known. The difference between the pilots and full on *Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn* were the pilots were like — since they were really small productions they were all single cam and only like a few producers sitting behind the camera, and very small stages. Some of them were like low budget, so it was not really a lot of crew. But on *Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn*, it's a completely different story. You have like four camera sometimes five, including a job or something and you have up to like — 300 or 400 crew on for the whole working 20/7. And you have so much stuff that goes into it and a lot of people don't understand when your child is an actor you are literally working like an adult. You work nine and a half hours a day, five days a week, sometimes six. So it is a very like — how do I say it? Very different from what most people know. We work — we literally work like adults and so are always working, there is not a time in the day when we are not really doing something. Like even at lunch we are expected to go over our lines and things like that. But — besides all of that, it is seriously like the best job in the world 100%. I wouldn't trade it for anything.

Cl: That's amazing and you sound so passionate about it. Love. Such a great thing to be able to do as long as you have that passion you will go very far. **IG:** Yes, thank you.

Cl: So obviously you were saying about *Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn*, you are obviously got character flow in that, surrounded by these teenage boys?

IG: Well I mean, we have had our ups and downs, but it is definitely the most challenging but — since then I have had my best friend on the show, Kyle. We have been made a recurring character so she is part of the main cast now. I love her and I have the same on the show when I absolutely adore. I love the parents on the show like 100%, like they are seriously some of my best friends and they are like so funny and so fun to be around. I just look forward to coming into work and getting to see them every day. So, it is really not as hard as people expect because, the reason I like hanging out with boys more — or why it is easier to be around girls than to come a little bit more drama and — when you are around boys, boys are — you know what I mean?

Cl: Yeah, definitely I get how you are feeling, 100%. That is really nice about your best friend, was she your best friend prior to the filming or have you two just got really close since?

IG: Oh, so absolutely. She has been my best friend for three years now. Ever since we first met it was something that clicked and she definitely is a big part of the show for me. It's always like — she is so fun to be around.

really talk about that they come out mid next year or late next year and I am very excited about it.

CE: How exciting, Hush! Hush!
EG: We start to work on them mid-February.

CE: I said I saw a video of Carson, the dog from Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn and how funny he is. His little puppy personality and he looks like a really stinky when he comes for his walk and making you carry him.

EG: Yes 100%. He is like seriously one of my best friends. He is the main dog in my life, besides my own dog because I see him every day. And every day, some people don't know this, but at lunch time every day I go and I walk him. We go and walk around the perimeter lot — he has business and all that stuff. CE comes, I will have to carry him back or otherwise he will just sit there and not move. He is literally demanding to be carried. I love that dog so much.

CE: How you, you are so funny. The video I saw was hilarious, so funny. You have your own dog, what is he called?
EG: It.

CE: Awesome. I love to swim, do you get any opportunity to do relaxing, or do you enjoy hobbies? Anything you can do — when you have free time that you can enjoy to do yourself?
EG: I love to bat, that is really relaxing for me. I just go to the gym and how it eat.

CE: Are you just being or his laughing too?
EG: No, usually just regular having with an instructor and private lessons and stuff like that. I love it. I had it once. One of my new things that I decided to try out a few months ago. I am absolutely in love with it and enjoy it so much. After I will get a protein shake or a tea or something but I love it.

CE: Well after a hard day of working nine and half hours and all your acting and everything, you can go and have your down time and get your frustrations out.
EG: Yeah, of course.

CE: So what is like an ideal day for Eazy? What would an ideal day in your life be like?
EG: How like off day?

CE: Either or tell us both, is your normal life a workday, what would you usually be doing?
EG: Oh, so — I finish school, so if I was doing school I would wake up at 7 and do school till 11. But since I am not in school I can come in at any which means I get to sleep in. But — that I do — so I come in early, not really — afternoon nine and I — come in and I usually go and grab my script which is in my trailer and I will read over that and have ten minutes before I have to go to rehearsal. Rehearsal usually lasts about four hours, up until lunch, and then we will have a thirty-minute lunch then rehearsal for another three hours. Then after the rehearsal is done

we have a big run through, that is where all the Nickelodeon executives come and the producers that have been writing all day like — while we do rehearsal and all that stuff with the director, the producers and the writers are up to the writer's room and they are writing new episodes and all that stuff. So, then we will do — the run through and that will last for about an hour, then we get home. On a shooting day we come in at around 11 and shoot all the way up till lunch which is about 2, then at lunch we have a thirty-minute lunch, then after that, we have a read through. That's when we get the script for next week coming in, so we have to have memorized the script for the episode we are currently working on, and the table read script which is for the episode next week. So really like I said there is no off time. Usually, at lunch, we are reading over the script that we need to take read. And table read is which the Nickelodeon executives come, sit down and we will read through the script for next week, go up to the writer's room and do more changes and all that stuff, revise it. Then we go right back to shooting and shoot up to maybe like — 4 or 7, depends on what time we come in because we can work nine and a half hours exactly and then after that — it is against the law to hold us any longer than the exact time. So, it depends how late, because if you come in late you are going to stay really late. If you come in really early you will probably get out around four or five.

CE: Wow, ok. Well, it is good that there are lines anyways or that would be working tonight.

EG: Oh, yeah, there is a long, it's about the size of an encyclopedia the book of rules is for the show. It's by law — so many rules it is really interesting them. I like sometimes we will go a little bit over — over time and just a tiny bit like five minutes besides — so we will have staged for five hours and thirty-five minutes. So, we will go maybe five minutes over, but if we do that the teachers, our set teachers, the people who do the school with us, they will literally walk on to the stage, take us back the hand, while they are shooting and walk out. Because — the time will have already been up and it will have been against the law by then. They walk outside the stage and grab us by the hand and then put us out. That has happened maybe two times, then the producers and stuff get the hint, so we can't do that because our teachers are very serious about the rules.

CE: Oh dear.
EG: They are really funny, they are so funny to be around. The teachers are awesome, love them to death.

CE: Awesome. So what is your favorite item right now in your closet? Do you have anything that you love to dress on whenever you are —

EG: I love I said, I am all about those neutral colors, but I love bomber jackets. I have a few of those, I have black, purple — green. I have a few different colors and I absolutely love these. Another thing that I am really into — this is just like 1980's style that I have on a pair of black halibuton leggings.

These will go with anything and you can dress them up, dress them down. These are 100% my absolute favorite things.

CE: They are perfect for the day, they are so comfy they are like my pajamas.
EG: Yeah.

CE: So do you have any other specific brands apart from hulu items that you tend to wear quite often?
EG: Designs as Regular Clothes.

CE: Well you could say both — on your regular day do you dress on anything? What label do you like to wear?
EG: Oh well usually I am wearing a lot of stuff from Top shop or — Urban Outfitters, American Apparel, just like comfy but cute because like I said, I am very into the style. It needs to match and all that stuff. So Topshop, Urban-outfitters, places like that — that are cute, but stylish.

CE: Awesome and obviously if you have special affairs or birthdays. Are there any particular designers you like to go and buy special outfits?
EG: Absolutely. Yeah I love Ted Baker and Kate Spade, I wear a few UrbanOutfitters-dresses, because they are simple but they have some like really good pieces and I love a lot of stuff from Top-shop and — we go to Nordstrom's a lot and get a lot of good stuff from Nordstrom's because Nordstrom's has everything, so we will get things from there that are awesome and — I love Rebecca Taylor and all those good brands, because they all hold up and are very — hold up in there — they won't fall apart in the wash. They are durable and stylish so that is what I love.

CE: Yeah, that sounds amazing. I know previously you did say you had some projects that you can't really divulge any information, is there any sneaky snippets you can let us in on in there?
EG: Well — think Christmas, that's all I can say.

CE: Think Christmas — huu.
EG: Yes.

CE: Oh —
EG: Next Christmas —

CE: Obviously — you are starting mid-February and should be late next year —
EG: Yeah that's all I can say but — you can — yeah Christmas.

CE: We can let our imagination run and see where we will see you in a year's time.
EG: Awesome, yeah and hopefully it will fly by as quickly as 2014 flew by. So I can get it out there and everybody can see it.

CE: Awesome, that is one thing about your job, when — rules, you can't discuss things, don't tell anybody about this. That must be — you are being very really like, I just want to tell somebody

EG: I know, that's probably one of the hardest things because especially with Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn, we haven't been on the air for a while. We have shot all these great episodes and all of those like really amazing projects like — I can't really say. Really long episodes like two-parters and stuff like that. Different amazing things and like — our characters have like grown up a little — I can't even say anything but I am serious, I want to tell someone so bad that you won't really revitalize of those things till early to mid-2017. So — because Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn does come back on the air on January 7th and we will get out an episode a week, but — there is just so many things that have gone on since then — I want to tell someone but it is all part of the contract that you have to keep your mouth shut, otherwise the iron hammer will come down. That is definitely one of the downsides to the job because you are not really allowed to say anything.

CE: Even in life, when you get news or you get some exciting news it is so hard not to share it.
EG: Exactly.

CE: Well I mean, I am going to come to a closing now. It has been amazing getting to know you Eazy, and if one day you come to New York, please e-mail me, we would love to meet you in person, meet the Push Kids Magazine team and yeah. That would be amazing, and hopefully, you can — live up your dream of coming to visit New York and see the sights.
EG: Awesome. Thank you so much, it has been such a pleasure.

CE: Wonderful, will enjoy the rest of your evening and — we can't wait for the magazine to come out and your press to be published, I'm sure it will be fantastic. I am sure your photo-book was amazing, didn't it?
EG: Yes, it was so fun and so like — very high-end and high fashion, so that was fun to do. Especially the fact I got to be in all these crazy, fun, cool outfits and I absolutely can't wait for people to see.

CE: How amazing. Oh, well have a wonderful evening. Thanks so much for your time I appreciate it. I know you are a busy lady. But — I wish you all the best with every project and all your future endeavors and — we will see you in the near future. I'm sure.

EG: Thank you so much and enjoy New York, enjoy the cold and the snow. It really doesn't snow in Texas but — enjoy your time, enjoy the cool weather.

CE: I know, I hope it does snow because my little secret I have will be looking forward to building a snowman so I hope it does snow sometime over Christmas. Pigeon-meat.
EG: Thank you.

CE: Alright then all the best, speak to you soon, have a nice evening.
EG: Thank you so much it was such a pleasure. ■

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

When Lizzy Greene was in second grade, her music teacher encouraged her to become involved in theater. Her knack for performing was obvious, and two years later, Greene was signed by an agent. "After going on my third audition, I booked 'Nicky, Ricky, Dicky & Dawn,' and before I knew it, I was on Nickelodeon," explains Greene. Since then, she has consistently worked 10 hours a day, five days a week. However, her current project, "A Million Little Things," has been her most impactful thus far.

Greene loves a challenge. It's emotionally taxing, and the deep places she is forced to go in order to play her character, Sophie Dixon, has led to her feeling more capable and evolved as an actress. Due to the early start of her career, Greene has been homeschooled since she was in fourth grade. "Being homeschooled is both a blessing and a curse. I have had to make a lot of sacrifices when it comes to personal experiences like spending time with friends and other extracurricular activities," says Greene.

She recognizes, however, that with these sacrifices has come a great deal of understanding and respect for the industry that she is so passionate about and thankful to be a part of. With feature films on her mind, Lizzy Greene is sure to find success in any opportunity that calls. ■



Try these before school for an a.m. energy burst!

1. THE PLATE HOUND-SAN CURBERS

Get into a pushing position with your shoulders stacked over your hands, holding your core tight. With each foot on top of a plate grab one from your midboard and use your arms to pull it back to your chest, bring it back to the start and repeat with the other leg. Keep your back flat and straight as you bring your knees in without sticking your butt up in the air. Repeat 10 times on each side.

2. REVERSE CRUNCH

Lean far back on your back with your arms bent by your sides. Raise your legs toward the ceiling and use your core to fully lift your feet and legs off the ground. From your legs and feet for five seconds. Keep your neck straight and to avoid not to touch your head. Return to the starting position and repeat 10 times.

3. BRIDGE

Lie on your back with your knees bent and your feet on the floor. Place your hands on the floor by your ears before doing, with your fingers pointing toward your shoulders to support your body as you lift your legs toward the ceiling and toward into a bridge. Place, then slowly come back down to the start position. Repeat 10 times.

4. SITUPS

Lie on your back, bend your knees at 90 degrees and plant your feet flat. Tuck your chin slightly toward your chest, and raise your arms off the floor so that they're parallel to your body and pointing toward your feet. Keeping your feet and back on the floor, raise your torso off the floor and toward

your thighs, coming up far as you can (15-20) to sit your lower back onto the floor. Keep the movement smooth as you lift and lower back to the start. Repeat 10 times.

5. BIKES

Lie flat on your back. Slowly raise your legs in the air with your knees bent. Lift your shoulder blades off the ground, then bring your right elbow to your left knee, while straightening your right leg. Switch sides by straightening your left leg, bending your right leg and bringing the left elbow to the right knee in a pedaling motion. Repeat 10 times on each side.

6. SUPERMANS

Lie face down with your arms extended at shoulder level. Pull your shoulder blades together and lift your arms, legs and chest off the floor, keeping your neck in line with your spine. Lower yourself to the floor. That's one rep. Repeat 10 times.

7. SIDE PLANK

Start in a pushing position. As you push yourself up, shift your weight to the left side. Lift your right arm and hold onto the outside of your left foot. Hold for a second before returning to pushing position and switching to the left side. Repeat five times on each side.

8. WALK PUSHUP COMBO

Stand with your feet together, arms at your sides. Bend over and place your hands on the floor in front of you. Walk your hands forward until you are in a pushing position. Do a pushup, then move your hands in place and walk your feet toward them to return to the start. Repeat 10 times.

How do you balance a full-time job with school and a personal life?

School is really important. The people I work with make sure that school is more important than my actual job. And if I'm not making good grades, then I can't film the show. I like to finish my schoolwork early. That's what I've been doing over the past three years. I finish it about seven months in advance. That way I don't have to worry about memorizing my lines along with studying for a test that's going to be happening the next day. When you get into the entertainment business, you have to grow up a lot faster, because you're working nine and a half hours a day. I've learned time management at 14-years-old, and I've learned how to do all these different things that some people don't learn until they're in their 20s and 30s.






